- After finishing your book, write a one-page reflection based on the following thoughts:
 - A) What are some real-world, real-life connections that you can make based on what a character did or said?
 - B) How did reading the book make you feel?
 - C) What surprised you or challenged your thinking (made you go "hmmm...")?
- The important thing is that your reflection demonstrates the thinking that you did as a result of the reading. Whatever you do, do <u>not</u> summarize the book!

HOW WILL WE USE THIS IN THE FALL?

Have this assignment (and the book that you read, if possible) in class with you on Friday, September 13, 2024. Remember, your thoughtful response to the book and your ability to discuss it in class will be one of the first impressions your new English teacher will have of you next year. Come prepared to think critically about the elements of your selected text. Your English teacher will provide more details in the first week of school.
